Introductions-

Purpose of meeting- Dr. Littlefield explained the reason for inviting the negotiations committee to the meeting with Dr. Livingston and expressed a desire to complete the necessary steps for Hooksett students to finish their High school year in Manchester.

Dr. Livingston mentioned Manchester certainly would like the students to stay and felt we could continue the discussion.

Dr. Littlefield said it's clear in the other contracts we have with receiving schools

Dr. Livingston said she had reviewed all of the other contracts that Dr. Littlefield sent and noticed the tuition amounts were not set from year to year in the other contracts like Manchester.

Ms. McHugh mentioned the other contracts came after the Manchester contract, and those rates are set by daily membership minus transportation and lunch.

Mr. Berry mentioned he felt it was important that Hooksett families knew if they would be able to continue at Manchester.

Dr. Littlefield mentioned what the agreement could look like

Ms. Boilard said it could be something simple as a letter from Manchester

Dr. Livingston agreed

Ms. McHugh suggested a continuation of the 2% increase the Manchester Settlement Agreement has for the 4<sup>th</sup> year. Then everything else would be discussed at the long-term contract negotiations meeting.

Dr. Livingston said that sounds reasonable and that she would need to poll the board for input but thought she could do that Friday

Dr. Livingston shared a few comments about her Administrator Work/Exchange trip to Brazil with us
