## HOOKSETT SCHOOL DISTRICT PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS OF STUDENTS

Each child must have a complete physical examination within a one-year period before entry into school. The Hooksett School Board requires a complete medical examination by a licensed professional one-year prior to entrance into sixth grade.

However, no medical examination shall be required of a child whose parent or guardian objects thereto in writing on the grounds such medical examination is contrary to his/her religious tenets and teachings.

Parents/guardians of students transferring to the Hooksett School District must present proof of meeting the physical examination requirement within thirty days of entrance. Students must meet state immunization requirements on the first day of attendance. Failure to comply with this provision may result in exclusion from school for the child.

A student must have an up-to-date physical to participate in the athletic program. The physical exam done previously on entering sixth grade will suffice.

No child shall be excused from regular physical education except on the written notice of a duly licensed health care provider or on the written request of the parents/guardians, subject to board approval, in which case an alternative program shall be provided. Temporary excuses on a day-to-day basis may be granted by the teacher upon the request of the parents/guardians.

Readmittance to physical education after prolonged illness/injury requires notice from a licensed health care provider.
