Treasurer duties:

1. Signs all checks released by the district - this is done electronically
2. Reconcile the checking account on a monthly basis - to be completed by the 15th of the following month

3. Keep track of checking account cash balance as they will need to reply to emails (typically bi-weekly) from Payroll and Accounts Payable to verify there are enough funds in the checking account to cover the checks being processed

Historically, this person has also been the SAU15 Treasurer and performs the same duties for the SAU as for the Hooksett School District.
