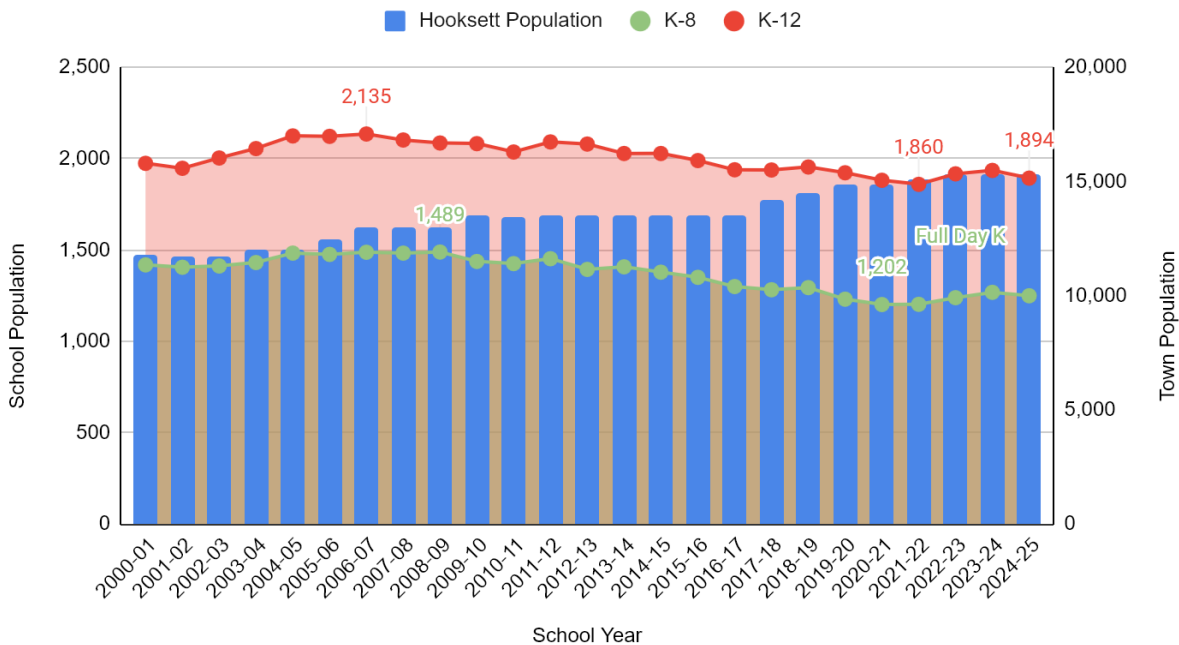

Looking back at the year, it's worth calling out two graphs on town and school demographics summarizing data from the past 25 years of annual reports.

Town Population and Student Enrollment Since 2000

Utilizing the aggregate reporting in the yearly Hooksett Town and School Report, plus estimates from the NH OSI (Office of Strategic Initiatives), one can see a growth in Hooksett total population from under 12,000 in 2000 to over 15,000 today. However, Hooksett overall student population peaked during 2004-2008, with a high of 2,135 students, falling by 275 to 1,860 in 2021. The Hooksett School Board implemented a transition from half-day kindergarten to full-day kindergarten for the 2022-23 school year.

Hooksett School District Historical Expenditures

The chart below captures the yearly annual expenditures and the regular education and special education subcategories, based on the definition of reporting specified in RSA 32:11-a. Regular education is provided overall and at a cost per student, which takes year-to-year student attendance (as shown in the chart above) into consideration. Yearly special education overall expenses are captured, though not calculated here in per-student terms given challenges normalizing that data.

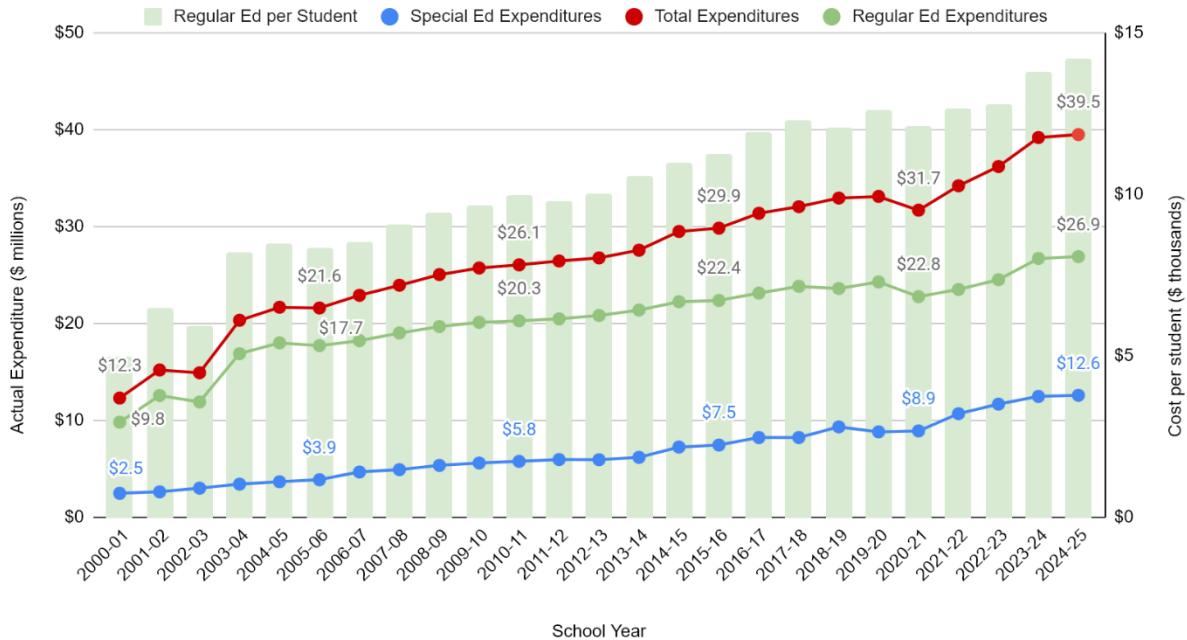
